

Student Injury and Sickness Insurance Plan for College of Saint Elizabeth Domestic Students

2013-2014



College of Saint Elizabeth is pleased to offer an Injury and Sickness Insurance Plan underwritten by UnitedHealthcare Insurance Company. **Eligibility Statement:** All full-time traditional undergraduate students taking 12 credit hours or more, all students in the Dietetic Internship Program where minimum credit is needed to graduate or complete course study, and all new incoming transfer students are required to participate in the plan on a hard waiver basis. All Graduate and Undergraduate students taking 9 credits or more are eligible to participate in the plan on a voluntary basis.

Highlights of the Coverage and Services offered by UnitedHealthcare StudentResources are:

- Up to \$500,000 for each Injury or Sickness Maximum Benefit for Covered Medical Expenses.
- Covered Medical Expenses for Preferred Providers are payable at 80% of Preferred Allowance and Out of Network benefits are payable at 60% of Usual and Customary charges (all benefits are subject to satisfaction of the Deductible, specific benefit limitations, maximums and copays as described in the policy).
- Preferred Provider Out-of-Pocket Maximum of \$7,500 Per Insured Person, Per Policy Year. Out-of-Network Out-of-Pocket maximum of \$7,500 Per Insured Person, Per Policy Year. - Prescription Drug Benefits: \$20 Copay for Tier 1 / \$30 Copay for Tier 2 up to a 31-day supply per prescription filled at a UnitedHealthcare Pharmacy (UHCP).
- Preventive Care Services which include, but are not limited to, annual physicals, GYN exams, routine screenings and immunizations are covered at 100% with no copay or deductible only when the services are received from a Preferred Provider. - FrontierMEDEX: – Domestic Students are eligible for FrontierMEDEX services when 100 miles or more away from your campus address and 100 miles or more away from your permanent home address. International Students are covered worldwide except in their home country.
- Online Services: UnitedHealthcare StudentResources Insureds have online access to their claims status, EOBs, ID Cards, network providers, correspondence and coverage account information by logging in to My Account at www.firststudent.com. To create an online account, select the "My Account" link and follow the simple, on screen directions. All you need is your 7-digit Insurance ID number or the email address on file. Insureds can also visit our mobile site at my.uhcsr.com to access an electronic ID card.
- Included with every policy, the UnitedHealth Allies® discount program provides 5% to 50% savings on dental and vision services, fitness clothing and equipment, and textbooks from McGraw-Hill Professional. The UnitedHealth Allies program is not insurance and is offered by UnitedHealth Allies, a UnitedHealth Group company.
- **When do I Enroll/Waive in the Plan? All students - OPEN ENROLLMENT PERIODS:** Annual Deadline – **9/17/13**; Spring/Summer Deadline - **2/7/14**;
- **IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL STUDENTS:** Open Enrollment Periods for all Dependents and Students: If you have eligible Dependents in the fall or, are a student in the fall semester and eligible to purchase coverage and you choose not to enroll for coverage before the Annual Enrollment Deadline of ***September 17, 2013**, your Dependents or you, will not be eligible to enroll again until the start of next fall unless you experience a "Life Status" change during the year. A life status change includes marriage, divorce, birth of a child or loss of coverage through no fault of your own (i.e. aging of your parents coverage). If your Dependents or you, experience a "Life Status" change, you must submit proof of the event and enroll within 30 Days of the event, otherwise you will no longer be eligible to enroll for the remainder of the policy year.

*For new Dependents or new students in the spring semester, your open enrollment deadline is **February 7, 2014**.

To complete the Enroll / Waive process, please go to www.firststudent.com, select your school, click on the Enroll / Waive insurance button and follow the directions.

Your student health insurance coverage, offered by UnitedHealthcare Insurance Company may not meet the minimum standards required by the healthcare reform law for restrictions on annual dollar limits. The annual dollar limits ensure that consumers have sufficient access to medical benefits throughout the annual term of the policy. Restrictions for annual dollar limits for group and individual health insurance coverage are \$1.25 million for policy years before September 23, 2012; and \$2 million for policy years beginning on or after September 23, 2012 but before January 1, 2014. Restrictions on annual dollar limits for student health insurance coverage are \$100,000 for policy years before September 23, 2012 and \$500,000 for policy years beginning on or after September 23, 2012, but before January 1, 2014. Your student health insurance coverage puts a policy year limit of \$500,000 for each Injury or Sickness that applies to the essential benefits provided in the Schedule of Benefits unless otherwise specified. Be advised that you may be eligible for coverage under a group health plan of a parent's employer or under a parent's individual health insurance policy if you are under the age of 26. Exclusions and Limitations

No benefits will be paid for: a) loss or expense caused by, contributed to, or resulting from; or b) treatment, services or supplies for, at, or related to any of the following:

1. Acupuncture;
2. Addiction, exclusion alcohol addiction, such as: nicotine addiction, except as specifically provided in the policy; and caffeine addiction; non-chemical addiction, such as: gambling, sexual, spending, shopping, working and religious; codependency;
3. Milieu therapy, learning disabilities, behavioral problems, parent-child problems, conceptual handicap, developmental delay or disorder or intellectual disability, except as specifically provided in Benefits for Treatment of Autism and Other Developmental Disabilities or as otherwise provided in the policy;
4. Biofeedback;
5. Circumcision;
6. Congenital conditions, except as specifically provided for Newborn Infants including those continuously insured under the preceding student policy issued by this Company;
7. Cosmetic procedures, except cosmetic surgery required to correct an Injury for which benefits are otherwise payable under this policy or for newborn children including children continuously insured under the preceding student policy issued by this Company;
8. Dental treatment, except as specifically provided in the Schedule of Benefits;
9. Elective Surgery or Elective Treatment;
10. Elective abortion;
11. Eye examinations, eye refractions, eyeglasses, contact lenses, prescriptions or fitting of eyeglasses or contact lenses, vision correction surgery, or other treatment for visual defects and problems; except when due to a covered Injury or disease process; except as specifically provided in the policy;
12. Health spa or similar facilities; strengthening programs;
13. Hearing examinations, except as specifically provided in the policy; or hearing aids; or other treatment for hearing defects and problems, except as a result of an infection or trauma and except as specifically provided in Benefits for Hearing Aids. "Hearing defects" means any physical defect of the ear which does or can impair normal hearing, apart from the disease process;
14. Hirsutism; alopecia;
15. Immunizations, except as specifically provided in the policy; preventive medicines or vaccines, except where required for treatment of a covered Injury or as specifically provided in the policy;
16. Injury or Sickness for which benefits are paid or payable under any Workers' Compensation or Occupational Disease Law or Act, or similar legislation;
17. Injury sustained while (a) participating in any intercollegiate, or professional sport, contest or competition; (b) traveling to or from such sport, contest or competition as a participant; or (c) while participating in any practice or conditioning program for such sport, contest or competition;
18. Investigational services;
19. Lipectomy;
20. Marital or family counseling.
21. Participation in a riot or civil disorder; Loss to which a contributing cause was the Insured Person's commission of or attempt to commit a felony or to which a contributing cause was the Insured Person's engagement in an illegal occupation;
22. Prescription Drugs, services or supplies as follows:
 - a. Therapeutic devices or appliances, including: hypodermic needles, syringes, support garments and other non-medical substances, regardless of intended use, except as specifically provided in the policy;
 - b. Immunization agents, except as specifically provided in the policy; biological sera, blood or blood products administered on an outpatient basis;
 - c. Drugs labeled, "Caution - limited by federal law to investigational use" or experimental drugs, except for expenses incurred in prescribing a drug for a treatment for which it has not been approved by the Food and Drug Administration if the drug is recognized as being medically appropriate for the specific treatment for which it has been prescribed in one of the following established reference compendia: (1) the American Medical Association Drug Evaluations; (2) the American Hospital Formulary Service Drug Information; (3) the United States Pharmacopeia Drug Information; or it is recommended by a clinical study or review article in a major peer-reviewed professional journal. Any coverage of a drug shall also include Medically Necessary services associated with the administration of the drug;
 - d. Products used for cosmetic purposes, except as specifically provided in the Policy;
 - e. Drugs used to treat or cure baldness; anabolic steroids used for body building;
 - f. Anorectics - drugs used for the purpose of weight control;
 - g. Sexual enhancement drugs, such as Viagra;
 - h. Growth hormones; or
 - i. Refills in excess of the number specified or dispensed after one (1) year of date of the prescription.
23. Reproductive services including but not limited to: family planning; fertility tests; including any services or supplies rendered for the purpose or with the intent of inducing conception; premarital examinations; impotence, organic or otherwise; female sterilization procedures, except as specifically provided in the policy; vasectomy; sexual reassignment surgery; reversal of sterilization procedures; except as specifically provided in the Benefits for Infertility Treatment;
24. Preventive care services; routine physical examinations and routine testing; preventive testing or treatment; screening exams or testing in the absence of Injury or Sickness; except as specifically provided in the Policy;
25. Services provided normally without charge;
26. Skeletal irregularities of one or both jaws, including orthognathia and mandibular retrognathia; temporomandibular joint dysfunction; deviated nasal septum, including submucous resection and/or other surgical correction thereof; nasal and sinus surgery; except for treatment of a covered Injury;
27. Skydiving, parachuting, hang gliding, glider flying, parasailing, sail planing, bungee jumping, or flight in any kind of aircraft, except while riding as a passenger on a regularly scheduled flight of a commercial airline;
28. Sleep disorders;
29. Supplies, except as specifically provided in the policy;
30. Surgical breast reduction, breast augmentation, breast implants or breast prosthetic devices, or gynecomastia; except as specifically provided in the policy;
31. Travel in or upon, sitting in or upon, alighting to or from, or working on or around any motorcycle or recreational vehicle including but not limiting to: two- or three-wheeled motor vehicle; four-wheeled all terrain vehicle (ATV); jet ski; ski cycle; snowmobile;
32. Skiing, scuba diving, surfing, roller skating, or riding in a rodeo;
33. War or any act of war, declared or undeclared: 1) While the Insured Person is serving in the armed forces of any country; 2) while the Insured Person is serving in any civilian non-combatant unit supporting or accompanying any armed forces of any country or international organization; or 3) while the Insured Person is not serving in any armed forces if the Injury or Sickness occurs outside the 50 states of the United States of America, the District of Columbia or Canada. A pro-rata premium will be refunded upon request for such period not covered; and
34. Weight management, weight reduction, nutrition programs, treatment for obesity, surgery for removal of excess skin or fat.
